Confirmation perfects Baptismal grace; it is the sacrament which gives the Holy Spirit in order to root us more deeply in the divine filiation, incorporate us more firmly into Christ, strengthen our bond with the Church, associate us more closely with her mission, and help us bear witness to the Christian faith in words accompanied by deeds. (CCC 1316)

Confirmation Lesson Outline: Students Only (All are mandatory)

- **Lesson #1:** Monday, September 18, 2017 (6:30pm-8:30pm)
 - Confirmands will receive blue Dynamic Catholic Books, and be required to bring them back every lesson
- **Lesson #2:** Saturday, September 30, 2017 (10:00am-1:00pm)
- **Lesson #3:** Monday, October 16, 2017 (6:30pm-8:30pm)
 - Note: Today's classes will take place in the Church nave
 - Due: **the Confirmation letter that you wrote to your child** should be handed in, inside an envelope with their name on it
- **Lesson #4:** Saturday, October 28, 2017 (9:30am-11:30pm)
 - Note: The times of this lesson has changed from original information due to scheduling conflicts
 - Due: Please make sure you have handed in your Confirmation letter to your child, as this is the last day to do so!
- **Confirmation Rehearsal & Retreat:** Saturday, November 04, 2017 (9:30am-1:30pm)
 - **Confirmation Rehearsal this day: A parent or responsible adult will stay for the first 30 minutes, to go over what the Confirmation day will look like.**
 - The retreat is run by Mike Landry
 - The confirmands will receive the sacrament of reconciliation on this day.
 - The confirmands will also be receiving the letter you wrote to them on this day.
 - Due for Confirmands: The **red folders** including the completed **service projects and letter** to Archbishop Richard Smith must be handed in at the beginning of the retreat.
- **Lesson #5:** Monday, November 13, 2017 (6:30pm-8:30pm)
 - Final day to hand in all projects and letters
- **Confirmation Sunday:** November 19, 3:00 pm & 6:00 pm Masses
